

## PowerPoint Activity #2: Dream Vacation

*“Last call for flight 101 to Paris...last call”*. Pretty soon you’ll be in one of the world’s most famous cities, known for its art, food, culture and so much more. But wait...

Mrs. Wiggins wants to reward you for a semester of hard work and help you absorb as much culture as possible, so he’s sending you on an extended trip to see even more places! Cost is not an issue and Mrs. Wiggins wants this trip to be memorable, so she’s offering you the opportunity to go to 3 spots...anywhere in the world...at his expense!

All you have to do is pick your destinations, provide a little information about each location and pack your bags! Bon voyage!

### Instructions:

Create a slideshow that features 3 places anywhere in the world (cities, regions, events, etc.) that you would like to travel to if you could take your “dream vacation”. Perhaps it’s a trip overseas to visit your cultural home, a city or country you’ve never been to or a big festival that you’ve always wanted to see. Regardless, use the Internet to find information, pictures, etc. and ensure your slideshow contains the following:

1. Proper title and outline slides to introduce the slideshow and content.
2. The following functions or features:
  - A variety of slide themes and backgrounds
  - An appropriate selection of slide, text and graphic transitions
  - WordArt and a table and/or SmartArt with stats or info. on the location
  - A hyperlink with each chosen location that allows you to click directly to an applicable website
  - Pictures and/or graphics for each location
  - Text formatting for the titles on each slide (shadows, reflection, glow, etc.)
  - A short video clip
  - A short audio clip or song
  - Any other features that will enhance your slideshow
3. Proofread your slideshow and then run a Spelling & Grammar check on it.
4. Save your slideshow to your M: drive as “Your Name\_Dream Vacation” and then drag & drop a copy to the appropriate HandIn folder (*ensure you save your file in .pptx format*).
